- Hand-held recorder
 - MicroTrack (\$199)

- Allows you to connect high-quality microphones directly to your computer.

Microphone Terms

Pick-up Patterns:

- Cardioid
 - Responds to sound mostly from the front
- Bi
 - Responds to sound from the front and back but not the sides
- Omni
 - Responds to sound all around

Mic Types:

- Dynamic
 - Rugged
 - Good for close-miking
- Condenser
 - Requires a battery or Phantom Power
 - Good for miking an ensemble and closemiking
 - Crisp, clear, detailed sound
- Ribbon
 - Fragile
 - Expensive
 - Warm, mellow tone

Microphone Options

- Blue Snowball USB Mic (\$99)
 - Condenser, Cardioid/Omni
 - Good for almost anything but best for podcasting
 - No interface required!
- Shure SM57 or SM58 (\$100)
 - Dynamic, Cardioid
 - Single Instrument, close mic





Microphone Options

- Shure KSM27 (\$200)
 - Condenser, Cardioid
 - Single Instrument or Ensemble (pair) - Excellent for strings/choir
- Audio Technica AT825 (\$375)
 - Condenser, Cardioid x 2
 - Ensemble Excellent for band
- Earthworks TC30 (\$1700 pair)
 - Condenser, Omni
 - Ensemble

 - Light Duty (\$30)









Setup for Stereo Recording

Check input levels







Good Levels



■ Split and Trim the regions

- Split: ₩-T
- Trim: Lower right/left corner of a region

■ Fade in/out

- Open automation window
- Click point on the blue line



Publishing

- Exporting/Bouncing
 - The final process to export a multi-track audio file with edits/processing to a single stereo file ready to be burned to CD.
 - AIFF or WAV, Stereo Interleaved, 16 bit, 44100 hz
 - MP3 or AAC compressed file formats
- This allows you to:
 - Add to iTunes library
 - Burn to CD
 - Email to a friend or post to the internet
 - Convert to MP3 first!
 - www.podOmatic.com free podcasting
 - Import into other software

Signal Processing in GarageBand

Equilization (EQ)

- Adjust the tone of the recording
- AUGraphicEQ or Equilizer

Reverb

- Add room ambience
- AUMatrixReverb

■ Dynamic Controls (Limiter/Compressor)

- Reduce the volume of the loudest levels to increase the overall volume
- AUDynamicsProcessor
